Course Aims:

This one-day Introduction training course aims to give you the skills you need to add and manipulate graphics within Web pages, which then can be applied to both company Intranets and the Internet. The course will examine in depth, the topic areas below as well as looking at integrating images that are created into New and Existing Website.

Course Outline:

Optimizing JPEGs

Optimize JPEGs and choose a quality setting using Export Preview.

Use enhancement effects like sharpening and smoothing.

View your image using split preview, and then export.

Optimizing GIFs

Optimize GIFs and customize palettes using Export Preview. Use enhancement effects like dithering and snapping to websafe colors.

View your image using split preview, and then export.

Animating

Animate using symbols and instances.

Apply effects to your animation.

Distribute animation elements to individual frames.

Export your animation using Export Preview.

Creating an Image Map

Create rectangular and oddly shaped hotspots and add hyperlinks.

Creating Slices

Create slice objects and define custom export settings. Attach hyperlinks and export.

Assigning Behaviors

Name slices objects and attach behaviors to them.

Link behaviors external objects.

Export the finished product as a group of slice objects.

Creating Rollovers

Create rollover buttons that respond to a user's actions.

Exporting Rollovers and JavaScript

Export rollover buttons with their accompanying HTML and JavaScript code.

Applying Live Effects

Apply single and multiple effects to objects.

Modify effects after applying them.

Store effects as presets.

Batch Processing

Use Find and Replace and modify file type and export settings while batch processing files of many types.

Target Audience:

This training course is designed for Web page creators & Designers who require additional training in the use of Graphics and Animation manipulation.

Assumed Knowledge:

Some previous experience of Web Development is required. Additionally a good understanding of the Internet / Intranets would be beneficial.
